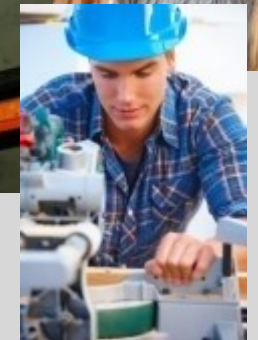
Since 1946, the American Federation of Labor and the Congress of Industrial Organizations (AFL-CIO) and United Way have enjoyed a cooperative relationship through which they and local United Ways have provided services to members of organized labor, their families and their communities.

United Way and organized labor work together to:

- Provide a Labor Leaders' Program which helps labor leaders, administrative assistants, shop stewards and other interested members learn about the available health and human care services in their areas.
- Assist in recruiting and organizing volunteers for the annual National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC) in their one-day, nationwide food drive.
- Recruit, train and help place members of organized labor in volunteer activities of health and human service organizations.
